

JUDGE ARNOLD'S ANTI-HARASSMENT, ANTI-CRUELTY Helpful Resources

*Call the POLICE if someone is constantly threatening, intimidating or following you in person or on the internet or by text. Stalking is a crime and a form of bullying.

*Call 911 immediately if you have been assaulted, beat up or injured because of bullying or domestic violence.

<u>Vulnerable Adult Abuse Michigan Hotline</u> – Call 1-855-444-3911 if you believe a vulnerable adult (elderly/disabled) is being taken advantage of by a caregiver

<u>Child Abuse & Neglect – Call 1-855-444-3911</u> to report child cruelty by a parent.

*IF YOU or someone you know is feeling hopeless or suicidal call 1-800-273-TALK (8255). In Monroe, call 734-243-7340. Or visit www.afsp.org.

*If YOU are being harassed and bullied in the WORKPLACE because of a legally protected personal characteristic, contact the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission at 1-800-669-4000 (Michigan branch) or visit http://www.eeoc.gov/field/detroit, or call a lawyer.

*Visit www.MichiganLegalHelp.org about how to get a Personal Protection Order or how to hire a lawyer to help you if you are being bullied or harassed and need court-ordered protection.

*If YOU are a STUDENT, PARENT or Caregiver of a student and a student is being bullied, report bullying to the teacher, school counselor or principal immediately.
